The Last Word...

A couple of weeks back, you had a parent/teacher conference to discuss your child's progress and hear how they are doing. It is always great to hear directly from teachers to understand the work taking place in class and how your student is doing. This Friday, your child will be bringing home their first-trimester report card. The report card is a benchmark to show how they are doing academically through the first 1/3 of the year. They will receive marks in reading, writing, math, science, and social studies and will also receive marks in art, music, and P.E. To help prepare for the event, you will want to know that a "3" means your child is meeting benchmark. A "2" means they are approaching benchmark,

and a "1" means they are below benchmark. These numbers have replaced the letter grades we all grew up with (and when I say "we," I realize in a few years, I'll probably need to say "I").

If your kids are anything like mine by chance, you may see a handful of 2's or maybe even a couple 1's scattered about the report card. I encourage you to take this information in stride and understand that it is not an end-all-be-all data point that puts your child behind the 8-ball. It is a snapshot of where they currently are and shares with us what areas we can celebrate and what areas we can help our kids improve.

Like most things parenting, the grades our children get are a part of the long game. We can choose to hyper-focus on the grade or take it as an opportunity to promote growth. And please remember above everything, no matter what their report card marks may be, they all are lucky to have you in their corner.
