School Climate Survey Results

Over the past several weeks, I will have included results from the 2021-22 Climate Survey sent out in February. I've also been re-posting information in our "Did you know" section of Rheemarks to help better explain school policies and practices. 246 families responded as follows:

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91% of respondents agreed with the statement, "My child feels comfortable expressing their identity at school."

Actual breakdown:

- 42.1% strongly agree
- 48.6% agree
- 4.0% disagree
- 0.8% strongly disagree
- 4.5% didn't know

89% of respondents agreed with the statement, "The school communicates the importance of respecting all cultural beliefs and practices."

Actual breakdown:

- 47.4% strongly agree
- 41.6% agree
- 4.1% disagree
- 1.2% strongly disagree
- 5.7% didn't know

68% of respondents agreed with the statement, "The school provides instructional materials that reflect my child's culture, ethnicity, and identity."

Actual breakdown:

- 26.9% strongly agree
- 41.6% agree
- 11.0% disagree
- 2.1% strongly disagree
- 18.4% didn't know
