# School Climate Survey Results

97% of respondents agreed with the statement, "The school has systems in place to encourage and reward positive behavior and contributions."

- 1.2% didn't know

## Rheem's Reward System

To help build a positive school climate and support student achievement, both academically and socially, Rheem utilizes two school-wide reward systems called Rheem Bucks and Gold Slips. Students receive Rheem Bucks from staff members across campus who catch them being Respectful, Helpful, Engaged, Empathetic, and Mindful. Students can redeem their hard-earned Rheem Bucks at the Rheem Store which is open every three weeks during recess time.

Gold Slips are another way for teachers and staff to acknowledge the students' hard work and kindness to their peers and staff members alike. Several Gold Slips from each class are pulled at a Spirit Assembly for the opportunity to spin the prize wheel in front of the whole school. We hold between five and six spirit assemblies each year. Any Gold Slip that is not pulled during a spirit assembly receives Rheem Bucks to use at the Rheem Store.
