RHEEMARKS: September 6th

Dear Rheem Team Families,

I hope you had an opportunity to enjoy the holiday weekend.

Before we jump into this week's Rheemarks, I wanted to start by sharing some reminders on the importance of keeping everyone safe at school and in the community.

1. **Symptom screener**: Although we are no longer filling out the daily symptom screener like we did last year, we are still asking families to check each morning if their student is exhibiting any COVID symptoms (symptoms can be found <u>HERE</u>). If they are showing any of these symptoms, please keep your student home.

2. **Close contacts**: If your student is identified as a close contact here at school, we will be contacting you and walking you through the next steps. However, in the event you are contacted by an outside organization (i.e., sports league, theater group, Girl Scout/Boy Scout, etc.) and notified that your student had been identified as a close contact, please be sure to notify the school. We will inform you of what next steps you will need to take to have your student return to campus.

3. **Mask wearing**: Rheem and the Moraga School District strongly encourages students to wear masks when inside and out. The reason we feel it is so important to wear a mask at all times while on campus has as much to do with remaining safe as it does with the county health department's definition of close contacts being considered inside and outside. This means if your child is considered a "Close Unmasked Contact," they will need to quarantine away from campus for ten days, as compared to a "Close Masked Contact" who can return to campus the next day (while following <u>THESE</u> protocols). Dr. Parks does a wonderful job of explaining close contact protocols on <u>THIS</u> video (her explanation begins at the 6:25 mark).

4. **Dashboard**: The Moraga School District regularly updates Covid-19 confirmed positive cases and quarantines on campus using <u>this DASHBOARD</u>.

5. **Test requirement**: In the event a student stays home from school because they are not feeling well, before they are allowed to return to campus, families are required to show proof of a negative Covid-19 test, or a note from their doctor documenting a chronic condition or alternative diagnosis, or quarantine for ten days from symptom onset. (*Please*

note that a rapid home test is not considered valid, and we ask that you receive your results from a testing site or medical provider.)

6. Local Covid-19 Testing Sites: MSD has partnered with our neighboring districts and communities to provide free access to <u>Covid-19 testing sites</u>. (*I recommend you create an account at this time by clicking <u>HERE</u>. By doing it now, you can save yourself time when you need it most).*

Did you Know?

Drop off/Pick up Times: Getting children onto and off of campus takes teamwork. To ensure the safety of all our students, we ask that you do not drop your child off before 8:10 am (early) or 9:10 (late).

There is NO supervision before those times.

If a student is dropped before 8:10 or 9:10 (official supervised times), they will be brought to the office and/or sent to Roadrunner Club (which may result in a charge).

Supervision after school is provided for 15 minutes after the dismissal bell. Students not picked up within 15 minutes will be brought to the school office. Any student not picked up within 20 minutes after their dismissal will be sent to Roadrunner Club (which may result in a charge).

Thank you for ensuring students arrive and are picked up according to the above supervision schedule to ensure their safety.
