Kindergarten & Transitional Kindergarten Registration

Welcome '18 - '19 kindergarteners!

Rheem will hold registration for next year's Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) students on **Thursday and Friday, February 1st and 2nd.** Registration will take place in Rheem's Room 25 from 9:00am – 2:00 pm on both days.

To be eligible for kindergarten, the child must turn 5 years of age by September 1, 2018. To be eligible for TK, the child must have their 5th birthday between Sept. 2 and Dec. 2, 2018.

Did You Know?

Last Friday, 1/19, was the half way point in the school year. Below is the year over year attendance rates. Daily attendance has decreased 2 tenths of a percent, while unexcused absences and tardies have increased from last year. With an intense flu season in full swing it's important we do everything we can to help our kids remain healthy and in school.

Attendance Counts

Did you know the Moraga School District only receives funding for students that are "in their seats," regardless of the reason for their absence? That's right, the state does not distinguish between "excused" and "unexcused" absences for revenue purposes. However, parents can help mitigate the loss of funding by choosing to complete an Independent Study or providing an Attendance Reimbursement (see below)

Independent Study

An "Independent Study" can be developed for a student who will be absent a minimum of five days to a maximum of eight weeks. Independent Study forms can be obtained by the child's teacher or in the front office and require the signature of the teacher, parent, and principal. The district receives attendance reimbursement for successfully completed independent studies.

Independent Study

Some parents choose to reimburse the district for revenue lost due to unexcused absences. For the 2017-18 school year, the average daily attendance (ADA) rate is \$41.61. A check payable to the Moraga School

District can be sent directly to the school to cover the cost of lost revenue due to extended family vacations or "extra" holidays.
