## The Last Word...

Early Thursday morning my wife Kelly shook my shoulder and said, "Get up! There's a fire at St. Mary's College and we have to evacuate." I can tell you I have been jolted from a dead sleep many times in my life but never have I been woken up to such alarming news. I went into my children's rooms and told them they needed to get up and get their shoes on. When they asked why, I told them there was a fire over the hill and we needed to be safe and get out of our house. Everyone was up and dressed in less than a minute and making their way to the car. I then went to our 80-year-old neighbor's house and banged on her door and told her of the ensuing fire and asked her to come with us. She grabbed her coat and purse and was out the door in less than a minute as well. As we were piling into our cars a Moraga police car drove by instructing everyone on their speaker to evacuate to St. Monica Church. We drove down our street toward the church and made the decision we were going to keep going (Kelly had a few choice words about being stuck in a church parking lot). As we made our way toward Canyon Rd. all I could envision was

throngs of traffic and cars trying to get out of town. To my surprise, and gratitude, the road was not that busy and we drove down Moraga Way unobstructed to the freeway in Orinda. Many neighbors and friends went to the St. Monica and Safeway parking lots, and a handful more made their way down to the BevMo lot in Orinda or out of Lamorinda altogether. We drove to my mother's in Concord and my children ended up sleeping the rest of the morning there.

As Kelly and I reflected on the morning events we were thankful of our fast departure and as we watched the news unravel even more thankful no people were injured or structures damaged. Every day I consider myself lucky to have such an amazing wife but, on this day, I couldn't help feeling more thankful for her attention to detail and emergency preparedness. We grabbed our "go bags" and several jugs of emergency water and were out the door in under two minutes.

Our conversation has since turned to reviewing our plans in the event of an emergency where we are not together (I'm sure Kelly will be fine...and well hydrated). I encourage all of you to take some time to go over your family's emergency plans and figure how this recent incident in Moraga might help in your plans (a couple of big things we learned):

- Keep a phone by your bed that is charging and on (Kelly received a call from a close friend who lived near the fire telling us we needed to get out)
- Communication can be spotty. Take the information you know and do what is safest for your family
- During "Red Flag Warning" times be more aware and check on your "Go Bags" and even duffle bags for each child
- We should have put an "X" on our front door to let emergency personnel and neighbors know we had evacuated
- In the event there is a scheduled power outage be sure to get some extra cash from your bank's ATM

There are more things to consider while building your emergency preparedness plans, and below are some good links for you to consider.

Kudos to all of our first responders for their amazing response and thank goodness all is still safe in Moraga. And with that said, let's do all we can to keep our families (and neighbors) feeling that same way.
