Students and staff will practice "Drop, Cover and Hold On" before evacuating the classrooms to the fields. We will also practice our "student release" procedures at that time.

Keeping in tune with the emergency drills we practice here at Rheem, the PTA wants to help our school be prepared for any of the unforeseen events in life. To that end, we ask that each child provide an "Emergency Bag" to keep at school by Friday, October 26. Please bring:

- A <u>small</u> item to comfort your child(photograph, handwritten note, cards, item no larger than your hand).

<u>DO NOT</u> include drinks (no juice or water). Please keep in mind these will be stored over the school year and every child in the class will be providing a bag, so storage space is limited.
