Below is a message from Rheem graduates Sadie Habas and Zoe Heidersbach.

We are members of Troop 30288 comprised of former Rheem Teamers now Freshman at Campolindo High School. Our Girl Scout Silver Award Project was the purchase and installation of two water bottle filling stations at Rheem Elementary School that we call "hydration stations." We began research on the project in 2016. We gave a PowerPoint presentation to the PTA to request the money necessary to complete the project, and they ended up agreeing to fund it! Over the summer, we purchased the stations and identified a contractor to manage the installation. We collaborated with the contractor, his team

(plumber, electrician, framing and stucco tradesmen) and the district head of maintenance to complete the project. Finally, the stations were installed in the beginning of the school year and now function and are used by students!
