Did You Know?

Truancy

A student is considered "truant" when the student has an unexcused absence of more than 30 minutes on three or more days during a school year. Since extended family vacations and other non-essential reasons for missing school are not considered "excused," Rheem's truancy rate is higher than you might think. During the 2015-2016 school year, 91 Rheem students were considered truant, based on this criterion. That's almost 23% of Rheem students! You can help reduce this statistic by scheduling family trips on non-instructional days and by making sure that students arrive *on time* and stay in school for the *full day*. Thank you!
