Thank you for your continued efforts to support your student's academics. Attendance is the greatest factor when it comes to student learning. It is important to keep in mind how essential it is for students to arrive on time and be present. Coming to school late poses a number of problems, most notably:

- gaps in learning (missed instruction)
- disrupting the whole class
- o habitual tardiness leads to an increase in absences

What are some things we can do to help improve our child's attendance and on time arrival?

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, the principal, or other parents for advice on how to make them feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Callon a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid scheduled medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.
