Rheem Spelling Bee: 3rd-5th Graders

Dear Rheem 3rd, 4th and 5th Grade Students/Families,

This year, the Scripps National Spelling Bee has developed an online testing platform that will allow Rheem to host a school spelling bee program, whether your children are learning in classrooms or remotely from your homes.

In place of our traditional spelling bee program, we will hold 2 levels of competition through online spelling tests. If your child is interested in competing, the first step to spelling bee participation is for you to register for the Scripps National Spelling Bee's online testing platform by visiting https://online-test.spellingbee.com.

Once you have registered, I will be able to assign the tests for your child to take. Your child must complete the test(s) before the given deadline, and these tests can be taken on any device with a web browser, including desktop computers, laptops, tablets and smart phones. Classroom competition testing must be completed no later than December 18th.

Six students from each grade (3rd-5th) with the highest scores will move on to compete at the school level. This year, our school-level competition will be administered via an online platform.

Our school champion will then move on to represent Rheem in the Contra Costa Regional Spelling Bee program, which also may include online tests in lieu of in-person spelling bee events.

The first step to spelling bee participation is to register at <u>online-test.spellingbee.com</u>. Please register at your earliest convenience as I will begin assigning tests to students as soon as you register. If you have already registered using the online testing platform for another child, you can log in to your account and add an additional child to that same parent account. There is no need to register a different email address for each child in your household.
