Their presentation talked about the importance of being in a school where students feel connected and cared for by one another. Please read below to find out about the "Welcome Wavers" four main themes.

Start with hello

In September the whole school took part in the Sandy Hook Promise program "Start with Hello," and this year's 5th graders did not want the valuable lessons and activities from that week to be for just 5 days. The program called for students saying hello to as many people as you can; sharing a smile with as many people as possible; sharing compliments with your peers for an entire day; spending time with new friends; and last but not least sharing random acts of kindness with your peers. It was decided that these themes/lessons were too good to last just one week.

1. Starting your day off on the right foot
