School Reopening Update

This week you will be receiving some very important communication from MSD and your child's teacher.

1.Monday: You will receive an email from me with information about your child's grade level cohorts. This email will contain directions on finding out your child's cohort and information about staffing at your child's grade level.

2.Tuesday: You will receive the Moraga School District's Site Operating Procedures (SOP) along with a Community Compact.

3.Wednesday: Information and reminders about pick-up and drop-off procedures, self-screening process, masks, etc...

4. Thursday & Friday: Teachers will be communicating asynchronous activities to K-3rd and 5th grade students.

In order to stay open for in-person instruction we need staff, students and parents to do their part: Stay home from school when you're sick, wear a mask, stay physically distanced, and wash hands frequently. Those actions, along with following any additional state and county guidelines, will help us support our students in person.
