## The Last Word...

I have to admit, I'm really looking forward to this Wednesday's "Conversation with Leslie Odom, Jr." I've always loved the theater and I was able to see "*Hamilton*" a few summer's ago on Broadway. I just missed Leslie Odom, Jr. and most of the original cast but nonetheless it was still an amazing show. The one hold over from the original cast who I did see that night was Christopher Jackson, (a.k.a. George Washington). His performance was spectacular. His powerful voice and message of struggle, and unity brought our first president to life. My favorite song that he was a part of, was "<u>One Last Time</u>," which is the conversation he had with Alexander Hamilton where the two of them craft Washington's farewell address.

In a more modest production, last Thursday Superintendent Burns announced his own departure to staff and families, effective June 30th. Mr. Burns said in his note to staff that "Over the years, I have received far more from you, our schools and this district than I have given, for which I am most grateful." The statement was a snapshot into how Mr. Burns has cared for our students, staff and families for nearly 25 years. This gift comes from years of Mr. Burns' solid experience and shared wisdom, and I'm so grateful to have benefitted from it.

Superintendent Burns, thank you for your commitment to the students, staff and families of Moraga. Your selfless leadership is a powerful reminder to all of us, it truly is all about the kids.
