The Last Word...

Last Wednesday I was very fortunate to listen to MEF's presentation of a "Conversation with Leslie Odom, Jr." The students, staff and Mr. Odom were amazing and the conversation around diversity, inclusion and the arts was transformational. The five student panelists (2 from JM and 3 from Campo) asked poignant questions which elicited great insight from Mr. Odom. Some of my biggest takeaways from the event were:

- ·Mentors need to provide two essential things to their mentees: honesty and time.
- Real growth comes when we are willing to take risks. When an individual dares to be special, they must first give themselves permission to be bold and to fail. When we liberate ourselves to try something out, we find out how to trust ourselves.
- ·We learn from others how to do things our own way.
- ·Trust your parents to help make decisions. In doing so they will eventually trust you to make your own.
- ·Have a person in your life whose experiences can give you perspective.
- ·Communal experiences unify us. We are meant to live in community, to share and help one another. Getting together and feeling something is primal and how we're wired.
- ·We have "do overs" as long as we are alive.
- ·There is no failure, we either win or we learn.
- ·Your preparation for any moment and for who you meet says a great deal about them.

When asked by a student what they can do to make a difference, Mr. Odom said for us to "start with our own corner of the world. Our homes, classrooms, teams or bands…It starts with the people who are in direct contact with you…Whatever you want to see in the world, make sure you see in your own community."
