School Climate Survey Results

Over the next several weeks, I will be including results from the 2018-19 Climate Survey that was sent out in November, 2018. 168 Rheem families responded as follows:

95% respondents agreed with the statement "School adults consistently model respectful behavior that creates a positive climate for learning."

Actual breakdown: 55% strongly agree; 40% agree; 2% disagree; 1% strongly disagree and 2% didn't know.

Once we become aware that giving feedback linked to specific efforts and process is much more motivating that non-specific praise for "fixed" attributes, our children will grow stronger and more resilient as a result.
