The Last Word...

Earlier this week, I read a short article called "<u>The Oldest Productivity Trick Around</u>." It talked about the simple power of a check mark and how checking off a task you set for yourself is empowering and, more importantly, habit-forming. The article's author, Amitava

Kumar, is a professor of English at Vassar College, and he challenges his students to write and exercise every day and make a note of it by recording it and checking it off in a journal.

Professor Kumar discussed how doing this daily activity reinforced who he is...a writer. I thought to myself, how would I define myself? Jobs I've held in my life: babysitter, mowed lawns and pulled weeds in the neighborhood, camp counselor, camp director, salesman, teacher, coach, and principal. I cannot remember a time in my life from the age of eleven that I was not doing one of those things (or more) to keep myself busy or make ends meet. However, when I look at this list, I would not necessarily consider myself any one of these things more than another, for as Professor Kumar defined himself as a writer, I'm not sure one thing defines me in that same way.

So as I pondered what type of task I should assign myself each day to remind me of who I am, I realized it would have to be a dad. No matter what the day or the occasion, I am a father to three very special children. They are mine and my wife Kelly's pride and joy, and to be a better dad can only make me a better person as a whole. So, I've decided to try and do one of the following things each day to try and be a better father:

1.Spend one on one time with each of my children

- 2.Read to my kids
- 3.Eat together as a family, at the table
- 4. Discipline in a calm and fair manner
- 5.Respect my wife mutual respect provides a secure environment for children

6. Practice patience

I look forward to bringing the power of the check mark to my most important job and encourage anyone else who would like to incorporate some better habits around parenting to follow suit. As Professor Kumar concluded his thoughts on the matter, he leaves us with a powerful reminder. "The check mark is more important than whatever comes of the daily work whose completion you're marking. The first represents actual living; the second, merely a life."
