(I'm pretty sure I could name all mine save one or two) In honor of teacher appreciation week it would be great for you to sit with your child and share with them all the teachers you had when you were in school. You can tell them what you remember most about your teachers and how thankful you are to have had so many caring adults help you through your most formidable years.

Each night at bedtime I lay down on my 2nd grade twins floor and sing them "You Are My Sunshine" with a few changes to the lyrics that help celebrate/highlight their day. At the end of the song my youngest daughter will ask me to tell a guick story about when I was younger. On a recent night she requested I tell her, and her brother, what was the nicest compliment a coach ever paid me. Sometimes when she asks me to tell a story with a particular topic I have to mull through my memories, but on this occasion, I knew exactly what I wanted to share. I told them of the time I saw a former coach, whom I had not seen in many years, at a USF men's basketball game in the late 90s. I remember vividly speaking with him and exchanging pleasantries as well as sharing what I had been up to (teaching and coaching high school basketball). Interestingly enough he was sitting next to his high school coach and he introduced me as a former player. When we finished our conversation, I walked back toward my seat and realized I had gone the wrong way, so I turned and walked by my old coach who was in midst of telling his old coach, "That kid we were just talking to played hard. I mean real hard." When I finished the story, my daughter said "That's nice dad, but why is that your favorite compliment?" I told her that's a great question, and that I think it's because he didn't talk about any particular talent I may have had but rather about the effort I gave to my teammates and to the game, and that the only thing we can truly control is the effort we put into sports, or school, or even our friendships.

And so it is with the teachers at Rheem. Every day they come to school and work hard, I mean real hard, and give our students their very best. Rheem teachers, thank you for all that you do and for making Rheem such an amazing place.
