Did you Know? Excused vs. Unexcused Absences

Did you know that ALL absences are noted as "excused" or "unexcused" for auditing purposes. According to MSD board policy, absences are considered "excused" for the following reasons:

- Illness
- Family emergencies
- Justifiable personal reasons (such as funeral attendance)
- Religious holidays

Absences are considered "unexcused" if they do not meet one of the abovementioned criteria. For example, missing school for vacations or "extra holidays" are unexcused. By definition of California Education Code, "a student who has an unexcused absence of more than 30 minutes on three different days, or more, is considered truant."

Thank you for your diligence in avoiding extended trips when school is in session.

News from Roadrunner

Dear Parents,

We are back in the swing of things, and having a great time with all of our Roadrunners. We are enjoying our art projects, food projects and outside play.

The After-School Enrichment Program (ASEP) begins Monday, October 1st. Activity Release forms are required for each child for each class. The release that you complete for the class is **NOT** the same one that Roadrunner Club requires. Click HERE for the Activity Release form or you may pick one up at Roadrunner Club. The Activity Release form gives us permission to send your child to class and it alerts us that your child is in class before they attend Roadrunner Club. We will not allow a child to attend an after-school class without an Activity Release form on file.

All schedule changes are now done online by parents. Common mistakes people make when going online to change their schedule are: they use the wrong pin # (Personal Identification Number), they use a different name (nickname), and they don't include both start time and end times. If you make a mistake it will not record your schedule change. Please be careful, and double check your entry, when entering information.

We are noticing that many of the parents are not completing the sign out process when they pick up their child. If you do not press the final DONE (hit enter 3 times) it doesn't register that you picked up your child. At the end of the evening when we reconcile the day, we end up re-creating when you

picked up your child. Therefore, we will begin charging a \$10 fee for no sign outs. (see the Roadrunner handbook which explains this fee).
