Did You Know?

As we all get back into the school routine, <u>here are a few important school procedures to review</u>:

- The Attendance Line (377-2086) should be called if your child is going to be absent from school for any reason. Please help us avoid this interruption by calling the attendance line in advance.
- Rheem parents who completed the Volunteer Clearance procedure in prior years, do NOT have to do it again this year. However, if you're new to Rheem, or new to volunteering, you'll need to complete the process outlined HERE. (P.S. We are very grateful for our volunteers!).
