The Last Word...

For years Rheem Elementary has utilized a "Growth Mindset" approach in the way it teaches our students. From teachers and staff to administration and families, growth mindset allows for student growth and an increase in malleable intelligence for our children. It teaches them that learning is a byproduct of dedication and effort compared to pure genetics. It also shows students how to deal with setbacks and challenges in a healthier way. Challenges, and to some extent setbacks, are an everyday occurrence in today's virtual classroom so the need to support student's Growth Mindset has never been more important.

The seminal study of Growth Mindset found that "a subtle change in how you praise someone can lead to a dramatic shift in their behaviors." When we praise someone for their effort instead of their ability, research found that students were more likely to enjoy challenging assignments and less likely to give up when facing a difficult task.

To promote Growth Mindset I encourage all of us to choose our words wisely and see what a difference they make. Now more than ever the power of growth mindset can make an improbable situation seem probable. I know Distance Learning is a challenge and your effort and attitude have made a world of difference in your student's experience this year, so if I may quote #11 on the list, "I admire the way you model respect and perseverance with your children."
